

The January 7, 2026, 10:00 a.m. meeting of the Lafayette Parish Communication Commission was held in the Emergency Operations Center at the Public Safety Communications Center.

Commissioners, or their alternates, present were: Troy Guidry, Bryan Champagne, David Anderson, John Bourgeois, Jonathan Neck, Ken Ritter, Kevin Savant, Paul Trouard and Timothy Hanks.

Others present were: Craig Stansbury, Jamie Guins, Monique Boulet, Brad Robin, Antionette Gerald, Mia Terry

It was moved by Anderson, seconded by Champagne and unanimously approved to accept the minutes of the October 8, 2025 regular meeting minutes as written.

On a motion by Champagne, seconded by Anderson, the Commission unanimously approved Resolution number 1010726 adopting the completed Louisiana Compliance Questionnaire for submission to the auditor.

On a motion by Champagne, seconded by Savant, the Commission unanimously approved Resolution number 2010726 authorizing the donation of a 2013 Triton Trailer with towable Baldor generator to the Parish of Lafayette.

On a motion by Anderson, seconded by Champagne, the Commission unanimously approved Resolution number 3010726 authorizing the disposal of equipment that is old, obsolete, has zero value and is no longer needed for public purposes.


Chairman Guidry stated that Lafayette Parish fared well in 2025 other than the winter storm and expressed his appreciation how well all agencies worked together during that event. He opened the floor for any questions or comments. Boulet reported that the homicide rate has dropped in Lafayette Parish.

Director Stansbury presented the data collected, as directed by the Commission, regarding the consolidation and/or centralization of the dispatch divisions of the Lafayette Parish Sheriff's Office, Lafayette Police Department and Lafayette Fire Department with the Lafayette Parish Communication District. Discussion followed regarding additional studies, funding options, and implications related to consolidation.

On a motion by Anderson, seconded by Savant, and unanimously carried, the Commission directed Director Stansbury to contact the auditor and attorney for the Lafayette Parish Communication District to confirm whether 911 funds could be used to cover the one-time renovation costs and a comprehensive consolidation/centralization study for all of the agencies that would participate in a consolidated system.

The Director made available the monthly budget to actual comparisons for the quarter and he announced that the next meeting date would be Wednesday, April 1, 2026.

There being no further business, a motion to adjourn was made by Champagne and seconded by Anderson and unanimously carried.
